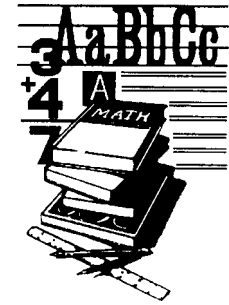
Youth Ministry Happenings:
