Common Pledge Practices

Some parishioners have indicated they would like to make a pledge to the campaign by donating stock or securities. If you own securities, stocks or mutual funds, it can be particularly advantageous to contribute in this fashion.

If you choose to contribute appreciated securities, you will receive a dual tax benefit: because you will avoid the capital gains taxes, which would be paid if the stock were sold, and you will receive a charitable deduction equal to the fair market value *at the time of the gift* as opposed to the purchase.
