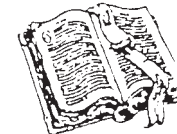

A Word from Your Pastor

Dear Parishioners:

Recently, we received this notice from the Diocese of Columbus. Some of you may have read about it before.



THE DIVINE NAME: The Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments issued a letter on June 29, 2008, which included a directive on the pronunciation of the Divine Name as signified in the sacred *tetragrammaton* in the Liturgy. The Divine Name (YHWH) is held as unpronounceable and is an expression of reverence for the greatness of God. The directive states that the name of God in the form of the *tetragrammaton* is not to be used nor pronounced in the Liturgy. OCP and WLP will be updating their publications, removing the Divine Name from their music hymnals. GIA does not have any songs that use the Divine Name. More details can be found on the USCCB's Committee on Divine Worship's website.

The point being made is simple: God is worthy of our respect and we ought not to forget it. Even though we can draw close to God, there are little ways we can show a heartfelt respect for Him. "Not taking the Lord's Name in vain" is one of the "Top Ten." Choosing with our Jewish "elder brothers" not to pronounce the Divine Name is a concrete way of showing our love of the God Who Is beyond all names.

We notice that many of the hymns which have the Sacred Name are part of our repertoire. As we catch them, we choose other hymns instead. From time to time, the Name comes up in a verse rather than the refrain. When that occurs, let's just do what the Hebrews did: replace the Name with "O Lord" if it is addressed to God, or "the Lord" if it is about God. As time goes on, our worship aids will make the necessary changes.

On another subject, Families are much in the news these days. Here are a couple you want to get to know who have newly been named as "Blessed," the step before Sainthood in the Catholic Church.
