## *A Word from Your Pastor*

Dear Parishioners:

Can you keep a secret? Have you ever managed to have a whole group of people work together to keep a collective secret? I can tell you that one great secret was held and revealed in a wonderful way right under your noses! Last weekend, which happened to include Valentine's Day, was the day my siblings and I – eight of us on earth and one in Heaven – chose to celebrate our parents' 50th Wedding Anniversary. We invited them to Mass at St. Timothy, which was not something unusual for them to attend, and suggested that we would go out for dinner, which has also happened before.



At the Mass, I was able to offer a Blessing of their Marriage in the midst of the congregation by blessing all married couples. With several couples married more than 60 and even 65 years, they could feel young again. The power of the Sacrament of Matrimony to sustain couples together is another great secret that was revealed in the number of folks who stood to receive the blessing, and especially in the number who were there at Mass with their spouses.
