A Word from Your Pastor

Holy Week brings us to the High Holy Days of our Catholic Faith. We are reaching the conclusion of the Lenten Journey and now preparing to enter into a whole new season of celebration of the fulfillment of God's Plan of Salvation.

I recall when I first began to study Theology in my seminary days. It began to dawn on me just how important the Resurrection of Jesus is. Up to that point, having been trained in the Catholic Faith all my life, it seemed that the Resurrection was just one of the things we believed. What I came to grasp was that the Resurrection is, in a manner of speaking, the Mystery that started the whole thing. If it were not for the fact that Jesus rose from the dead, His teachings would have faded into history with barely a trace. Perhaps He might have been recalled as an itinerant rabbi and would be Messiah. But nothing more. The Resurrection makes all the difference. It is central. We believe that Jesus is the Son of God and that His teachings are true because His whole Life was validated in the Resurrection. His disciples who were fearful men on the day of His Crucifixion became bold and fearless proclaimers of the Gospel through the power of the Resurrection at work in them.

Have you taken time to reflect on the most important aspects of Catholic Faith? This week is a time to see the Mystery unfold through the most impressive Liturgies of the Church. The whole Church Calendar takes its shape from the establishment of the time of Easter. That should remind us of its importance. But have you allowed the Liturgies we celebrate during this time to form you and to bring you to a deeper understanding of your Faith?

Easter Sunday is always an amazing experience with the sheer number of folks who find their way home to Church. But equally amazing is the flow of the days that lead up to that glorious Sunday. Give yourself a spiritual treat, a "reward" for having lived a good Lent: come to the events of the Easter Triduum, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter Sunday. The Mass of the Lord's Supper (Thursday), the Celebration of the Lord's Passion (Friday) and the Easter Vigil (Saturday) constitute one Liturgy that expresses the Paschal Mystery. The Life, Suffering, Death and Resurrection of Jesus are the means by which God accomplished our Salvation. Let's learn more about that wonderful Truth together in our Worship of the Savior Who died and rose for us.
