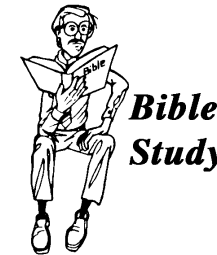
**PRAYER AND SPIRITUALITY**
