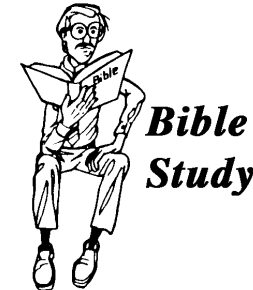

A WORD FROM YOUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners:

This week saw the journey of our 8th Graders to our nation's capital. They were sent on their way, along with the principal and several parent chaperones, by a special blessing early Tuesday morning. Day by day, they saw places that represent the history and future of our nation. When I offered the blessing, I told them that their journey was meant to be an educational experience, but also a pilgrimage of Faith. Our Catholic Faith is not meant to be a pastime, a matter that is separate from everything else. Rather, it is to be our beacon, the "map" that helps us find our way.
