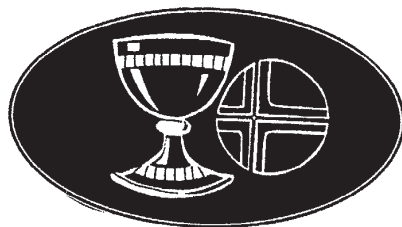

GOLF SCRAMBLE – ST. CHARLES FOOTBALL FUND RAISER

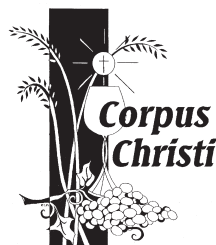

A Word from Your Pastor

Dear Parishioners:

This weekend, we celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Feast of the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. We honor Jesus in His Eucharistic Presence among us. We acknowledge that we receive the very Substance of the Lord Himself when we share Holy Communion. It is truly Jesus, the Risen and Ascended Lord of Glory, Who gives Himself to us as Food, the Bread of Life.

This was a special weekend in the life of my former parish, the Church of the Blessed Sacrament in Newark, where we observed it as our Parish Feast Day. So, I invite you this weekend to keep the people of Blessed Sacrament in your prayers. For better or for worse, as I told them, they formed me as a Pastor, since Blessed Sacrament was my first pastorate. I let them know before I left last July that they would receive the credit or the blame for how I turned out as a Pastor. Now that I am getting ready to mark the first anniversary of my arrival here at St. Timothy, I can say with some confidence that my time at Blessed Sacrament served me well to prepare me for all that we are now doing together at St. Timothy.

All the parishes and people I have served have taught me a lot and you reap the benefits. The Feast of Corpus Christi reminds us that we are all part of the One Body of Christ, united in Faith around the Altar. We are fed and nourished by the Living Bread and we become a means of grace for one another and for the world. Let us live up to this noble calling as members of the Body of Christ.

Sunday is the "Lord's Day"

Sunday, the "Lord's Day," is the principle day for celebration of the Eucharist because it is the day of the Resurrection. It is the preeminent day of the liturgical assembly, the day of the Christian family and the day of joy and rest from work. Sunday is "the foundation and kernel of the whole liturgical year." (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, #1193)

The precept of the Church specifies the law of the Lord more precisely: "On Sundays and other holy days of obligation the faithful are bound to participate in the Mass." The precept of participating in the Mass is satisfied by assistance at a Mass which is celebrated in a Catholic rite either on the holy day or on the evening preceding the day.

The Sunday Eucharist is the foundation of all Christian practice. For this reason, the faithful are obliged to participate in the Eucharist on the days of obligation, unless excused for serious reason (for example, illness, the care of infants) or dispensed by their own pastor. Those who deliberately fail in this obligation commit a grave sin. Participation in the communal celebration of the Sunday Eucharist is a testimony of belonging and of being faithful to Christ and to his Church. The faithful give witness by this to their communion in faith and charity. Together, they testify to God's holiness and their hope of salvation. They strengthen one another under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, #2180-2183)
