A Word from Your Pastor

Dear Parishioners:

With this weekend, we return to the cycle of readings that are part of Ordinary Time. The “overflow” of Easter and Pentecost into Trinity Sunday and Corpus Christi now gives way to the numbered weeks of Ordinary Time. The 12th Sunday invites us to look again at the question of Who Jesus Is. We see storms in two readings: Job’s encounter with God in the whirlwind and Jesus asleep in the boat until He is awakened by His frightened disciples. No doubt we also see storms present in our lives and in the lives of our families. Can we respond with Faith and trust?

As this bulletin goes to press, I am away for some Continuing Education at a Conference on St. Paul. I was originally scheduled for a Retreat sponsored by the Diocese of Columbus, but it was canceled due to few participants. So, I found another opportunity. The Retreat will come later. The only group affected by my absence during this round will be the daily Mass crowd. Mercifully, I was able to find “supply priests” for the week. But it was not easy. Please pray for vocations.

This year we had three men ordained to the diaconate for the Diocese of Columbus; they will be ordained to the priesthood next year. That is good news. However, two of them are “chronologically older” than I am. That means they will be valued coworkers, but they won’t be “my replacement” when I get to retire in 20-25 years. Let’s work on inviting young men and women to consider life in the service of the Church. My 24th Anniversary of Ordination to the priesthood is Monday. I can testify that these have been challenging but rewarding years. God is never finished with His surprises. I would highly recommend this experience to any young person willing to commit to a life lived for others. The earthly rewards are not financial, but they are many. And the retirement benefits are “Out of This World!”
