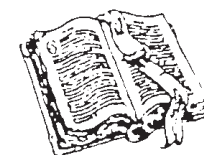

A Word from Your Pastor

Dear Parishioners:

Pope Benedict XVI sits in the "Chair of Peter" as he guides the Church throughout the world. It is his responsibility to encourage and strengthen his brothers and sisters as we seek to bring Christ to the world. The Pope is the sign of unity of the Catholic Church. Bishops and local Churches (dioceses) are one with each other through their Communion that is expressed in a living relationship with the Apostolic Authority that resides in the Pope. This week we celebrate the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul (June 29) and so the Bishops of the United States have established the Annual "Peter's Pence" collection to fund the Charities that the Holy Father supports. Giving to the weekly collection is our care for our own needs as a parish family; offerings taken up as a "second collection" are our true acts of charity.

The Year of Saint Paul will end with the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul. It has been a wonderful year of reflection and study on the works of the Apostle to the Gentiles. We have already begun the Year for Priests (*Annus Sacerdotalis*) on the occasion of the 150th Anniversary of the death of St. John Vianney, the Curé of Ars. As a Church, we acknowledge the gift that the ordained priesthood is for all of us. We also pray for priests and for those who are being called to the priesthood.

Our own bishop has established particular days of prayer in observance of the Year for Priests: the first Thursday of the month, the Chrism Mass and the Ordination Mass next May. In the Year for Priests, I invite you to call to mind the priests who have had an influence on your life.

In the next several months, I believe you will also begin to see the theme of Evangelization emerging in the Diocese and in our parish. The Lord calls all of us to proclaim and witness our Faith in Jesus Christ. How are you responding to the Lord's invitation?

Reflections on the Mass

One of the great debates in Israel and among rabbis of many centuries is the question, "Who is a Jew?" Judaism is not a race, although if your mother is Jewish you are considered Jewish. But there are converts. One answer might be that a Jew is someone who keeps the Passover in the living community and tradition of Judaism and keeps the Law of Moses. The Passover Meal remembered the faithfulness of God to His Chosen People in dramatically and miraculously saving them from genocide in Egypt. Keep that memory, proclaim that miracle and you might be said to be a Jew. It is celebrated in the first person, as though Jews today remember what God has done for them personally in Egypt. Jesus was observing the meal of God's covenant with Israel, the Passover Meal, when he gave us the Holy Eucharist, the present remembrance of the new covenant with His new Israel. Now God has not just saved His people from killers in a particular time and place, but has saved us from death itself. Who is a Catholic Christian? One answer might be that it is someone who keeps the memory of Calvary in the ritual new Passover meal, the Mass, and who lives the Law of Christ, the Law of Sacrificial Love. The Catechism says: "The Eucharist is the memorial of Christ's Passover, the making present and the sacramental offering of his unique sacrifice, in the liturgy of the Church which is his Body." #1362
