Reflections on the Mass

We always pray in the Holy Spirit, to the Father as the Son. Mass can only happen because of the gift of the Holy Spirit. Otherwise, it is just a crowd of people, thinking wishfully and having some bread and wine. But because the Holy Spirit exists among us, we are configured to be so like the Son that we are called the Body of Christ; and in that Spirit, we offer by Christ’s merits worthy worship of the Father. We are drawn into the very life of the Holy Trinity when we are “born again” in Holy Baptism. No power of evil or sin, not even death, is stronger than this Holy Spirit which enables us to gather for the miraculous transubstantiation of the bread and wine into the very Body and Blood of Jesus Christ by the actions of the priest. This changes everything. From time to time, it is good to remind yourself what you are doing at Mass: praying in the Holy Spirit, to the Father as the Son. Everything else is just details.

Praying in the Holy Spirit to the Father as the Son means that we do not address very many of our prayers and hymns to the Holy Spirit. Pentecost certainly gives us many prayers and hymns to invite the Holy Spirit to come and make something of us, but given that gift of the Holy Spirit, our prayers are addressed to the Father. After the priest invites us to prayer, “Let us pray,” there is a prayer which invariably is addressed to “Father” or “Lord,” which in this case always indicates the Father. We pray as the Body of Christ.
