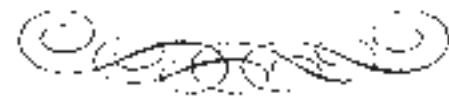

He became Bishop of Ephesus and there died as a martyr, being stoned to death there, in A.D. 95, when he opposed the pagan festival of Katagogian in honor of Diana.
