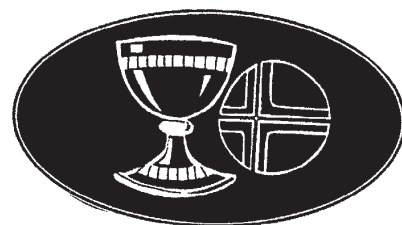

## A Word from Your Pastor



Dear Parishioners:

Winter has its hold on us. The Seasons of the year can serve as symbols for the life of our souls. As we experience the cold of the winter season, we can imagine what life would be like for us without the gift of Faith. For most of us, this is a gift that has been given to us through our families and in such a way that we tend to take it for granted. Our grandparents and our parents were people of Faith and they shared that Faith with us. Our own first response was perhaps a simple acceptance as the way things are.

We now live in a time when Faith can no longer be taken for granted. The generations past whose lives of Faith were examples for us have much competition. The pervasive culture in which we live has less and less room for God and Faith is seen as a purely private matter, hardly to be shared. If Faith is to continue in our world, we must choose to put it into practice.

How are you putting into practice the Faith that was entrusted to you? Do your children have an example in you that invites and encourages them to put God first? Do you teach them by the way you live not to allow anything else to stand in the way of their practice of the Faith. How does your example stand up to comparison to the Faith of your parents and grandparents?

Next weekend, January 24, at 2:00 p.m., we will celebrate a Holy Hour in the Presence of the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. All families are invited to participate. If you are not able to come as a family, then send at least one member of your clan as a representative. We will include three "themes" in our prayer for this celebration: our Parish Feast of St. Timothy (January 26), Vocations in the Year for Priests, and Respect for Life in the face of the current culture. Let this be an invitation to you and to your family to prepare for a true Springtime of Faith. May the cold of Winter give way to the warmth and the light of Faith.

- L** Listen and Learn about her feelings, thoughts, wants, values, and beliefs, her perceptions of her needs, pressures, strengths, and resources (She must believe you care for her, not just her baby!).
- O** Open her Options of abortion, parenting, and adoption, lovingly, with accurate facts.
- V** Introduce a new Vision and Value that she is made in His image and has been redeemed. She can be forgiven, healed, and can make positive choices for herself and her baby.
- E** Extend and Empower her to carry through, with concrete resources and support.
