Principal's Report-(report submitted). Results of the Terra Nova testing were presented. All classes performed very well. The tuition proposal for school year 2009-2010 includes a 1% increase over the current rate. The actual cost to educate one student will be \$4688; non-participating families will pay the full rate. St Timothy currently has 5 Ed-Choice tuition students and has space to accept 5 more. These students are evaluated on an individual basis before being admitted to the school. A coach has requested that the school consider academic eligibility as a condition for playing middle-school sports. Discussion of the matter followed.

Pastor's Report-(report submitted). Discussion concerned setting up electronic transfer of funds for collection contributions, and improving communications regarding pledge commitments and reaching out to non-participating families.

School Board-March's meeting included discussion of the grading system. The current check/plus system will remain in place for grades 4 and 5; letter grades are added in grades 6, 7, and 8. Changes in the city busing schedules next fall will dictate the school schedule at St Timothy. Changes are yet to be determined. Nominations are being sought for 4 school board positions which will be vacant at the end of this term.

Youth Ministry-A newsletter was distributed outlining upcoming activities. A mission trip to New Philadelphia is being considered in place of the trip to Portsmouth. The diocese is losing both the youth director and program coordinator positions.

Finance-The committee is looking at stewardship for the parish. An activities fair is being considered for next year. Efforts are being made to communicate with parish members about current activities and their level of satisfaction with those programs. Information is also being solicited on activities that are desired but currently not offered.

Expenses are in line with last year. Collection income is down \$23K compared to last year through the end of February. We continue to pay down the balance of the capital campaign. Maintenance costs are expected to increase substantially next year. The proposed budget will be presented at the May meeting.

The Silent Auction is ahead of break-even costs. Donations have been made to cover Dr. Griffin's cost; donations to the auction will be accepted through April 17. Mass Appeal is catering the event.

Religious Education-(report sent). A student was baptized at a school Mass. Three persons will be baptized at the Easter vigil, including one 8th grade voucher student. The 2nd grade Communion class will provide an honor guard for the Holy Thursday processions. An 8-week college-level Scripture course is being considered.

Liturgy Committee-(report sent). Ushers are being recruited. Their role is being expanded to include offering greeting to Mass
. The committee is soliciting input and observations on the liturgies. St Tim's would like to offer a parish mission by Lenten time next year.

Maintenance-(report submitted). Baptismal font repaired in time for vigil. New list of items for repair submitted. Discussion followed concerning lighting, placement of crucifix over altar, and focal point in sanctuary. Committee is seeking input on changes being made to existing lighting.

New Business-Jim Connors attended the deanery meeting (minutes and agenda sent). Visitor Mark Hill presented his suggested revisions to the council constitution. The parish is looking for a festival coordinator to take over for Janis Browning. The parish office is collecting responses to women's club surveys. First Communion will be April 25.

Meeting adjourned 9:15 pm.

April 2009**

1. Parishioners who have died recently are: Margaret Hixson and Gene Dennehy. May they rest in peace.
2. Thanks to all who made our Easter Liturgies wonderful celebrations. We congratulate Newly Baptized or Received into Full Communion in the Catholic Church, who were also Confirmed with the Holy Spirit, and welcomed to the Eucharistic Table are: Deion McGraph, John Hamlett, Megan Decker, Connie Denise O'Connell and Anna Lee Hixson. Congratulations to these newest members of our Parish and Faith Community. They now bear the name "Neophytes," which means they are "New Creations" in Christ.
3. First Holy Communion Mass was celebrated April 26th for 39 children. We congratulate our children and their families on this happy occasion.
4. Our thanks to all who had any part in the Jazz Fest April 24th. Special gratitude goes to Dr. Larry Griffin and his music group for making it a wonderful success in its first year. Congratulations to the committee who worked so hard to bring it to completion.

5. Our P.S.R. students will have a May Crowning ceremony May 3rd at 11:40 a.m. and will participate in the Noon Mass as they end this year. Remember to honor our Heavenly Mother in a special way this May with your family. The School's May Crowning will be at the Wednesday School Mass May 6th.
6. Next weekend is *Bishop's Annual Appeal weekend*. We ask that you prayerfully consider your gift so that the diocese can continue its ministry and mission. Our diocese covers 23 counties and the need is great. We invite every family to consider a gift of \$300 or at the Miter Club level of \$1000 or more. No gift is too small. We will once again conduct in-pew solicitation. Pledge envelopes will be provided next week end. Thank you very much.

Our Bishop's Annual Appeal target this year is **\$59,965.41**. *This amount is actually lower than last year's goal of \$64,465.50, which was missed by only \$517.50 according to original pledges (\$1717.50 after pledge reductions according to the final report).*

7. Projects ahead of us: Campaign for St. Timothy next steps, Promotion of Electronic Transfer, Communication with School Families regarding Parish Support of the School, Invitations to non-participants.

PRESENT:**First Communion:**

First Communion this past Saturday was beautiful. The children were an inspiration to everyone present in their love for the Eucharist. I hope that everyone had a chance to look at their First Communion Banners. The First Communicants also did a wonderful job as the Honor Guard for the Eucharist during the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday.

RCIA:

We have six new adult Catholics at St. Timothy. Deion McGapth, John Hamlett, and Megan Decker were baptized (in our Baptismal Pool), confirmed and received Holy Communion during the Easter Vigil. Connie O'Connell and Anna Lee Hixson made a profession of faith, and receive Confirmation and Holy Communion during the Easter Vigil. Mark Schwenning made a profession of faith, and receive Confirmation and Holy Communion in December.

RCIA is in its final period called mystagogia where the new Catholics reflect on the Initiation Sacraments and Resurrection, discuss aspects of discipleship such as evangelization and ministry within the Church, and look to the future as active participating Catholics in this parish and in the universal church.

PSR:

PSR collected 219 food items for the St. James the Less Food Pantry during Lent. The last PSR class of the school year takes place this coming Sunday. The last time together will include a shortened class followed by a May Crowning Rite in the Church. PSR students and staff will then participate in the 12:00 noon Mass (proclaiming the First and Second Readings and bring the gifts forward during the offertory procession). After Mass there will be a light reception in the Cafeteria to celebrate the year together.

Bible Studies:

The *Wednesday Bible Study* has only two classes left. Next week they will finished examining the early Church through the Acts of the Apostles and the following Wednesday they will conclude this study by reviewing how far they have come and considering what they would like to do next.

The *Tuesday Bible Study* is in the middle of their study of Paul using a book written by our own Sister Carolyn Thomas, titled Reading the Letters of Paul

FUTURE:

The Catholic Institute of Biblical Literary will be hosting their Bible Study here at St. Timothy beginning in September 2009 and concluding with a Graduation Mass in the Spring 2011.

Looking at the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program as a possible preschool and early elementary Montessori based Religious Education program for St. Timothy.

Evaluating this past year and preparing for next year's PSR, RCIA, Initiation Sacraments, Adult Formation, etc.

**Liturgy Committee Meeting
April 19, 2009**

**Preliminary Notes for 2010
Palm Sunday, March 28**

Palms will be blessed at each Mass in the cafeteria
Check sound in cafeteria and Church
Since the palms are not blessed they will not be available for pick-up on the way into church
Weather permitting there be a procession out the south door and back into the Church's main entrance; if weather is an issue the procession will go out the north door and down the hall to back of the church
An announcement will be made in the church prior to the procession to encourage those who are physically able to join in and bring hymnals??
Can music be piped outside to facilitate singing?
Palms will be passed out in the Church for those who are not able to be in the procession - need ushers/sacristans to assist
Need ushers to help direct congregation to re-seating efficiently and toward front
Fr. Tim/presider reads the part of Jesus; Dcn Marion reads the narrator (8 and 10 am) and one more reader needed
Incense at the 10 am Mass

Holy Thursday, April 1, 7:30 pm

Incense will be used, two thurifers
The First Communion class will be the honor guard
The children will assemble in the multi-purpose room
Need an MC (high school student or adult)
Procession in will be thurifer, cross, candles, first communion class, lectors, Dcn Marion and Fr. Tim
Consider having the children bow in unison to the altar before entering the pews from the side aisles
Ask for volunteers after Mass to have their feet washed –supplement as needed by special invitation
Letters to be sent by Fr. Tim to committee chairs to ask them to be participants in the foot washing
Mark the floor for every third chair
Fr. Tim will wash the feet of twelve individuals in the sanctuary and
Dcn Marion will hand him the water jug and towels
Anticipate needing 2 jugs of water, 2 basins
Servers will bring new towels, remove used towels, and bring additional jugs of water as needed
Five servers will be needed - consider recruiting buddies for the First Communion class and/or adults

One of the servers and Dcn Marion will help Fr. Tim w/humeral veil which has been placed on the first pew

Choir or servers to ring the bells during the Gloria

Auxiliary Altar will be in the cafeteria and the Eucharist reposed in the Sacristy veneration (about midnight)

Procession out will be cross, candles, children, congregation beginning from the front, choir, Dcn Smithberger, two thurifers, and Fr. Tim

Show the procession map to the servers

Make sure that there is enough distance between thurifers and the Fr. Tim

Practice with two thurifers, 3 sets of 3 clicks and then rotate

The procession will begin down the center aisle and turn to the right and then turn to the right to go down the north side aisle, across the front and exiting the church via the south side aisle. Weather permitting the procession will exit via the main entrance and return through the cafeteria's south entrance; if the weather is an issue the procession will go down the hall and enter the cafeteria through the north door. Once in the cafeteria the children will make two lines facing each other leading up to the auxiliary altar. The children should be far enough apart to allow two adults to walk comfortably side by side between them. The congregation will go straight to their seats. The choir, Dcn Marion, the thurifers and Fr. Tim will walk between the children.

After Fr. Tim has passed through the children, their teacher will lead one line over to the east side of the congregation.

Fr. Tim will incense the Blessed Sacrament and then pray in silence

When Fr. Tim departs, the servers will lead the children in silence back to the multi-purpose room

In the final procession there should be 2-4 choir members who fall in immediately after the children and in front of their teacher to lead the singing on the way into the cafeteria

Organize public prayer for adoration

Good Friday, April 2, 1 pm and 7 pm

The altar cross is covered in red

Does choir want to chant Passion with Fr. Tim?

Two servers with candles will accompany Dcn Marion to the confessional where the cross is stored and all three will process in

Dcn Marion will chant "Behold the Wood of the Cross"

Fr. Tim will sing the intercessions at the altar

Two servers needed to hold the cross –put candles on either side of the cross base
Fr. Tim, Dcn Marion and the servers venerate the cross first

Dcn Marion will wipe the cross (could use a third server, possibly an adult, to wipe the other side)

Need two hymns during adoration

Sing Reproaches

Two servers with candles will accompany Dcn Marion to the sacristy to bring the consecrated hosts to the altar center aisle w/o procession

Easter Vigil, April 3, after sunset

Need MC, thurifer, candles and cross

Need chrism for confirmation

Reflection for the candidates and catechumens at ____rehearsal at _____

Fire consider having scouts light a bonfire weather permitting

If weather is questionable no bonfire - fire will be lit outside if possible but in the foyer by the door if necessary

36" Pascal Candle has been donated

Make church as dark as safely possible pre-vigil

Dcn Marion chants "Christ our Light"

Lights come up a little as Pascal Candle enters church enough to allow congregation to safely enter pews

Individual candles are lit from the middle of the Church off the Pascal Candle

Pause long enough for most of the congregation to be in the Church

4-6 people closest to the candle should take responsibility for initiating the spread of the flame

Exsultet to be sung by Dcn Marion- raise the lights once slightly

All 7 Readings plus the Epistle and the Gospel. Minimum of 4 readers needed

Psalms to be sung between readings TBD by the Music Ministers

__ candidates and __ catechumens

Candidates wear albs throughout and the catechumens put on an alb after their baptism- need to be sure we have __ albs that fit- easy to get on and off?.

Warm water

Put a towel down to step on coming out of the font to prevent slipping

Instruct catechumens to put on clothes that are easy to put on (can put on dress clothes after the service)

The Fr. Tim, catechumens, and sponsors process behind Dcn Marion carrying the Pascal Candle (the Pascal Candle base needs to be moved during the procession to the baptismal font)

After the Vigil - need to move the candle and base back to the sanctuary

Reception after Mass for the newly baptized and confirmed (volunteers needed)

Litany of the Saints to be sung by cantor

Easter, April 4,

Largest attendance is 10 am Mass, full choir

Pre-set chairs for overflow at 10 and 12

No extra Eucharistic Ministers will be used to serve the back of the church

Incense at the 10 am Mass

Music-More alleluias

Divine Mercy, April 11

Fr. Tim confessor

Dcn Marion to lead service

Need Cantor and 2 servers

MAINTENANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

4-30-09

I. ITEMS REPAIRED THIS MONTH:

- 1.Replaced burned out bulbs in the church. Redid all the lower lighting, bringing the lights down further into the fixture and replaced with lower wattage bulbs. Brighter bulbs in the choir and over the sacristy area. Made notes for maintenance to keep w/back-up replacement bulbs for entire church.
- 2.Redirected altar lighting with Father and Deacon, placing more on the crucifix, table and some on the celebrants. Those light fixtures are very dated and the bulbs heavy duty (like car head lights) and the light is extremely hot. Some of the bulbs are burned out - we will not be replacing those. As more burn out we will be replacing the 4 light strips that light the altar area.
- 3. Replaced missing chain to close off baptismal font basin.
- 4. Repaired hole in gym wall and repainted area.
- 5. Learned about circuit breakers for lighting in church and made notes for maintenance to keep.
- 6. Learned about dimming switch for church and how to prepare for Easter vigil service.
- 7. Leaned about circuit breakers for lobby base board heating & made notes for maintenance to keep.

III. ITEMS SOON TO BE REPAIRED:

- 1.Remove stumps from behind school with a bobcat.
- 2.Gutters, downspouts and drains-hired out.
- 3.Peeling paint over front entrance door: Tom Pelland
- 4.Loose pews, kneeler feet and a cracked hymnal holder.
- 5.Lighting in church: Terry Install track lighting over choir director, and Tabernacle.
- 6.Repair jagged carpet edge under church choir door.
- 7.Repair step trim in cry room.
- 8.Painting the center ceiling of church front to back.

IV. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION:

- 1.Before we paint the ceiling in the church: Father would like council's opinion on the look of our sanctuary in regards to the crucifix. Is it hidden by the light coming in through the stained glass window behind it? Would it be better if hung towards the congregation hanging from the wood beams? Putting it in front of the priest as he celebrates instead of behind him.
Where does our focus go when we first enter the church?
We have redirecting the lighting to the altar and crucifix. Can you see the crucifix better now?
